

Local, state and federal codes have been passed, such as Local Law 26, initiated after the events of 9/11, requiring commercial office buildings to prepare Emergency Action Plans (EAP) to support buildings and instituting procedures to follow in non-fire related emergencies. Having a well articulated plan in place is only the start. Conducting the necessary fire and emergency drills and training are just as equally important. EAP drills are required to be conducted twice a year for the first year upon FDNY acceptance of the Plan and once a year thereafter, with fire drills being conducted semi-annually. Knowing what to do in an emergency and being able to effectively carry out that plan can save lives. For this reason, Croker Fire Drill Corporation strongly believes that not only training, but proper training by a highly experienced professional, is a necessity in this day and age. Once in place, fire and EAP drills collectively ensure that everyone knows exactly what to do in an emergency. Occupants are also trained on shelter-

ing-in-place, in building relocation, partial evacuation and full building evacuation.

WHICH OPTION IS THE RIGHT ONE?

The recent 5.8 magnitude earthquake was an important reminder of the need to know which of these options to follow based upon actual, local conditions. As some buildings shook and swayed in New York some property managers immediately called for full evacuation when that may not have been the correct approach—imagine large crowds out on the streets imperiled by falling debris from shattered windows and broken cornices. Clearly, in that instance and in certain other types of emergencies, a full evacuation may not be the first or best

option. Fortunately, no reports of popped out windows and falling masonry were reported in New York, while in Washington, near the epicenter, there was exterior damage to many buildings, including cracks in the façade of the Washington Monument and collapses of the towers of the historic Washington National Cathedral.

The Code now calls for Fire Safety and Evacuation Plans and Emergency Action Plans for office buildings to be combined into one submittal.
